

St. Francis Pilgrimages began after Bret and Katia Thoman - both Secular (Third Order) Franciscans - attended a retreat in Loreto, Italy led by local Franciscans in 2003. The friars took them on a mini-pilgrimage where they discovered the hidden Franciscan places of that region. Immediately, they had a desire to bring English-speaking people on such a pilgrimage. Since then Bret and Katia have dedicated themselves full-time to their pilgrimage ministry, and destinations now include all of Italy.

They have organized over 50 pilgrimages and personally journeyed with 1,200 people of more than 20 different nationalities throughout all of Italy. Groups have been large or small, and have originated in the US, Canada, Ireland, Guam, Singapore, Japan, and Malaysia; they have been parishes, families, colleges, youth groups, retreat centers, secular Franciscan fraternities/ regions, and others.

Bret and Katia Thoman have been married since 2002, and they made their profession as Secular Franciscans in 2006. They have two small children, Claremarie and Iacopo. They live in Georgia (in the US), but visit Italy often.

Bret has a masters degree in Italian and a certificate in Franciscan studies. He is currently the director of formation for his local fraternity in Georgia, Immaculate Conception. He has worked as a teacher and translator of Italian, as an airline pilot, and has written two books (see below). He currently writes, gives flight instruction, and is a part-time instructor for St. Francis University's Franciscan studies program (ICFL) Click here for link.
